SINDH GRADUATES ASSOCIATION

The Sindh Graduates Association (SGA) is one of the largest voluntary civil society organizations of the country. It evolved from the coming together of a small group of enlightened individuals concerned about the poor level of development existing in the province of Sindh. They wanted to contribute with their labour and talents to a cause which had not received the attention, it truly required. The Association has come a long way since it was first formed in 1972 as a non-profit, non-sectarian and non-political civil society organization. It is a registered body operating under Societies Registration Act (XXI) of 1860 registered on September 29, 1972. Today it boasts up a membership of over 11,000 graduate volunteers with the network of 126 branches in various towns and villages of Sindh as well as one each branch office in Islamabad and Lahore.

Background of the Association:

At the beginning, the SGA might have seemed too ambitious to some for assisting the people of its region in the problems that stem from poverty and official lack of direction. It attempted to work in just about every field and discipline that needed attention to health, basic education, vocational training, income generation, emergency assistance and socio-cultural activism.

Following the principle of “for the people, by the people”, the SGA did not rely on any governmental or international assistance for the first 18 years of its existence. The volunteer members, including both management and field representatives, continued to mobilize funds from alternative sources throughout this period for what was to become a unique grass roots organizational effort in this part of the world. Since 1990 for the first time its dedication and determination to its services received formal recognition through institutional assistance. Now the SGA has its strong base of working and funding, which is contributions by the members of the Association, donation by general public, grant in aid from Government of Sindh.



Then national and international organizations assigned various projects to the SGA and also gave donations. SGA worked with these national and international organizations for implementation of developmental projects in various thematic areas. The organizations include; The ILO, UNICEF, UNESCO, CIDA, the World Bank, SPO, OXFAM, TVO, SEF, SDA, SANA, ActionAid Pakistan, RSPN, INFAQ Foundation, Khushhali Bank, USAID, Jummani family, PPL, Asia Petroleum, Sindh Education Foundation etc.

It is a non-political humane social organization recognizing inter-cultural and inter-personal interaction for national harmony and peace among all sectors of population and its objective was to empower the people to take decisions on their own and become partners in policy decision-making process so that sustainable development is ensured.

SGA's Regular Programs and Activities:

Education Sector:

Education is one of the main thematic areas of the Association. At present, the Association has been running a network of 22 Roshan Tara Schools across Sindh Province and imparting quality education at an affordable educational system from Primary to Higher Secondary level. The Roshan Tara Schools mostly focus on the poor segment of our community. Besides, the Association has been running and managing a boarding Public School Gadap, Karachi on a Public Private Partnership basis with the Education and Literacy Department, Government of Sindh. The Management and quality of education is one of the successful case studies for SGA and Government of Sindh.

Roshan Tara School Network is an enduring example of the vision of the founders of Sindh Graduates Association (SGA). The school network was established with the objective of providing quality education to the underprivileged sections of society in Sindh. Today, the Roshan Tara School Network has grown to have 22 branches scattered throughout the province, serving communities that lack access to quality education.

The school network follows a unique model of education that focuses on fostering critical thinking, problem-solving skills, and creativity in students. The curriculum is designed to meet the needs of students from different backgrounds and to prepare them for the challenges of the modern world. The teachers are well-trained and qualified to deliver quality education to the students. RTS Network is playing a crucial role in promoting education and empowering girls and women in Sindh. The school network has a particular focus on promoting the education of girls and ensuring their equal participation in the classroom.



This is especially important in a region where girls face numerous barriers to education, including poverty, cultural barriers, and gender-based discrimination.

Through its commitment to quality education and gender equality, the Roshan Tara School Network has become a beacon of hope for the communities it serves. The school network has helped improve the literacy rate in the region, providing students with the skills they need to succeed in life. The RTS network is focused on providing access to education for



children who would otherwise be unable to receive it. The network is particularly concerned with improving the education and opportunities for girls, who often face significant barriers to education in the country.

The Roshan Tara School Network has been successful in its mission to provide quality education to underprivileged communities in Sindh. The RTS network has created a sense of community among the students, teachers, and parents who are involved in the schools. The schools have become a hub of activity and learning, and they have had a positive impact on the overall development of the communities in which they are located.

Overall, the Roshan Tara School Network is a testament to the power of education to transform lives and communities. It is an inspiring example of what can be achieved when dedicated individuals come together to address the challenges facing their communities.

Since last one decade SGA has gradually focused much of its attention on education given the phenomenal vacuum both in terms of school participation and the quality of education in Sindh. SGA despite resource constraints (where it maintains a low fee structure averaging Rs. 1000 per month in order to make it affordable for the poor and marginalized families) has achieved a visible outcome in education outcomes. The last 5 years results show that a predominantly large percentage of SGA children (around 75%) have been attaining A and A+ grades in Secondary and Higher Secondary level.



The alumni of Roshan Tara Schools shine brightly like stars scattered across the vast galaxy of our society. These distinguished individuals, known as Roshan Tarians, are present in every corner of the globe, making significant contributions to a wide array of fields and industries. Whether it's in education, healthcare, business, technology, or the arts, Roshan Tarians have proven themselves as leaders, innovators, and change makers. Their achievements serve as a testament to the strong foundation and values instilled by Roshan Tara Schools.

Not only have these exceptional individuals brought pride to their alma mater, but they have also helped raise the profile of the Sindh Graduates Association, showcasing the remarkable potential of Sindh's graduates on the global stage. Through their hard work, dedication, and commitment, Roshan Tarians continue to inspire the next generation of students, proving that the legacy of Roshan Tara Schools is not just limited to academic excellence, but extends to creating a lasting impact on society as a whole. Health Sector:

Sindh Graduates Association has given more importance to health sector to reach the poor and needy people in their miseries. Our health services include the establishment of the Al-Shams Medical Center in Pano Akil, which offers free healthcare to the community, as well as regular medical camps addressing issues such as eye care, skin treatment, cleft lips and palates, hepatitis, and measles vaccination. Additionally, the Association has been actively involved in emergency and relief efforts during natural disasters like earthquakes, floods, and droughts.

For several decades, the Sindh Graduates Association (SGA) has been a pioneering force in addressing healthcare inequities across Sindh since 1978. Through its sustained efforts in organizing General Medical Camps, SGA has become a beacon of hope for underserved and marginalized communities, bringing essential healthcare services to their doorsteps. These initiatives are powered by the unwavering commitment and selfless dedication of local volunteers, who have tirelessly worked to ensure that no community is left behind. The SGA's healthcare model is firmly aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) 2030, particularly SDG 3: Good Health and Well-being, and reflects its mission to create lasting, sustainable health solutions.



Over the years, SGA has responded to the healthcare challenges faced by vulnerable populations, where access to even basic medical services remains a distant dream. Through its decades-long history of organizing General Medical Camps, SGA has consistently worked to break down barriers caused by economic hardships, geographical isolation, and inadequate public healthcare infrastructure.

Association has been conducting free Eye camps, Skin camps and General Medical camps and so far 609,752/- patients have been operated for eye diseases and 432,307/- have been treated free with provision of medicines, in skin camps for chronic skin diseases and 439,470/- treated free in general medical camps

Women Empowerment

Women Empowerment is also very important thematic area of the Association and has always supported this initiative. SGA has always supported women through various activities and initiatives and enable the women to participate in social, welfare and culture activities. As a result, SGA has two voluntary women branches one each at Karachi and Hyderabad.

The Association has been running two Women Empowerment Centers at Roshan Tara Schools and giving training of tailoring on sewing machines for the last many years at Mirpurkhas in collaboration with Khushhali Bank Ltd and at Bachal Goth Malir Karachi in collaboration with Asia Petroleum Limited. These initiatives aim to provide support to poor women from lower working class with professional training, enabling them to improve their socio-economic status and contribute to the local economy. Through this initiative hundreds of the women are now the beneficiaries and they have successful stories.



Cultural and literary work of SGA:

Literature serves as the custodian of cultural heritage, reflecting the soul of a community and safeguarding its identity. Within the cultural mosaic of Sindh—a province renowned for its profound history, artistic expression, and spiritual wisdom—literature stands as a timeless bridge between the past and the future. The Sindh Graduates Association (SGA), through the dedication of its office bearers and volunteers across various branches, has played a pivotal role in fostering and preserving Sindh’s literary traditions and promotion of the culture. By supporting writers, publishing books, and organizing literary events such as Awareness Seminars, Conferences, Classical Music programs, Mach Kachheries on bone fire, social gatherings, celebration of evenings with renowned writers, literary personalities and pay homage to social and development sector personalities etc. SGA arranges cultural programs to promote art and culture in the region.



In addition, the Association has always made sincere efforts for the promotion of Sindhi Language and culture. In this regard, SGA arranged national and international conferences on Sindhi Language and culture. SGA volunteers, through their selfless dedication, ensure that Sindhi language is a cornerstone of Sindh’s identity, embodying its traditions, expressions, and philosophies. By supporting literary works in Sindhi, SGA not only preserves the language but also promotes its relevance in contemporary society.

SGA Islamabad Branch: A Hub of Community Service and Cultural E

The SGA Islamabad Branch has been a beacon of community services engagement, and cultural enrichment in the Federal Capital and in attainment of these services at large scale. SGA has established Shah Abdul Latif Community Centre (SALCC) on land of one acre allocated by CDA Islamabad with praiseworthy efforts of Late Hazar Khan Bijarani, the then Federal Minister. Throughout the past many years, the branch has been actively engaged in various activities that promote the welfare of the community, foster knowledge, and celebrate Sindhi Culture. The branch's commitment to community service is evident in its various initiatives as described below:

- Collection: 10,000+ books (Novels, Safar Nama, History, Biography)

2. **SHAH LATEEF BHATTAI AUDITORIUM:**

- Established: 2000
- Capacity: 362 seats (Extendable to 400).
- Facilities: Conference sound system, 45KVA generator, central heat & cool, 30-car parking, green rooms.

3. **SGA YOUTH HOSTEL (DORMITORIES):**

- Established: 2006
- Capacity: 35 persons.
- Facilities: High-speed internet, common TV room, 24/7 kitchen, hot/cold water.
- Beneficiaries: 15,000+youth.

4. **SGA WORKING WOMEN HOSTEL:**

- Established: 2019
- Rooms: 30
- Facilities: Kitchen, dining hall, daily mess (3x/day), laundry.
- Utilities: Generator backup, 30KW solar system, high-speed internet.
- Security: 24/7 with CCTC and 2 guards.
- A total of 219 female beneficiaries both long-term and short-term, have been accommodated in the hostel. Presently, 106 females from various provinces and remote areas of Pakistan are residing in the facility. **Resident from Sindh gets 18-20% discount.**

5. **SGA MALE YOUTH HOSTEL PROJECT (2025-2026):**

- Capacity: 10 Rooms (25 beds) + 3 dorms (45 beds)
- Facilities: Dining hall, generator backup, elevator, solar system, fire safety. (Work-in-progress)

The persistent scarcity of potable water in the arid regions of Tharparkar, Badin, and the Thar Desert presents a critical challenge to human and livestock survival. For years, the Sindh Graduates Association (SGA), in collaboration with local communities and volunteers, has been implementing sustainable water solutions to address this crisis. Constructing and maintaining community-based underground water wells has emerged as a long-standing initiative. For many years, the **Sindh Graduates Association** has championed initiatives addressing potable water scarcity through community-led solutions. SGA not only addresses immediate needs but also fosters resilience and long-term development in the most vulnerable areas of Sindh.



To counter these challenges, SGA has leveraged its expertise, local networks, and partnerships to implement sustainable, community-based solutions. Over the last five years, SGA, in collaboration with local branches, volunteers, and NGOs, has spearheaded **the construction and maintenance of hundreds of water wells and hand pumps**. These wells serve as sustainable water sources, addressing not just immediate needs but also fostering resilience in these communities.

The Sindh Graduates Association's annual water well initiative has emerged as a beacon of hope for the vulnerable communities of Tharparkar, Badin, and the Thar Desert. By providing access to clean, reliable water, fostering community ownership, and aligning efforts with global development goals, SGA continues to strengthen the resilience and prosperity of these communities, ensuring a better tomorrow for generations to come.

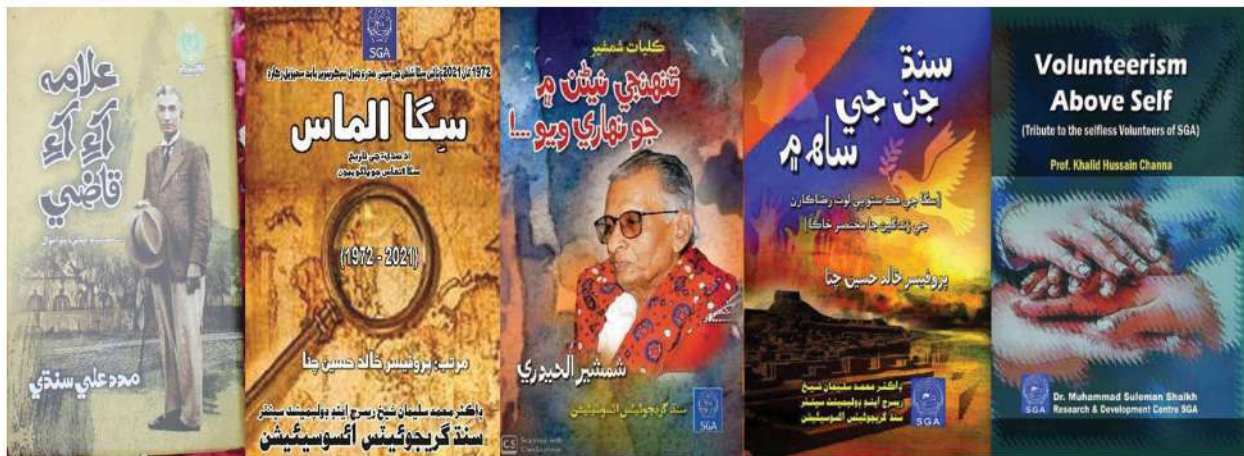

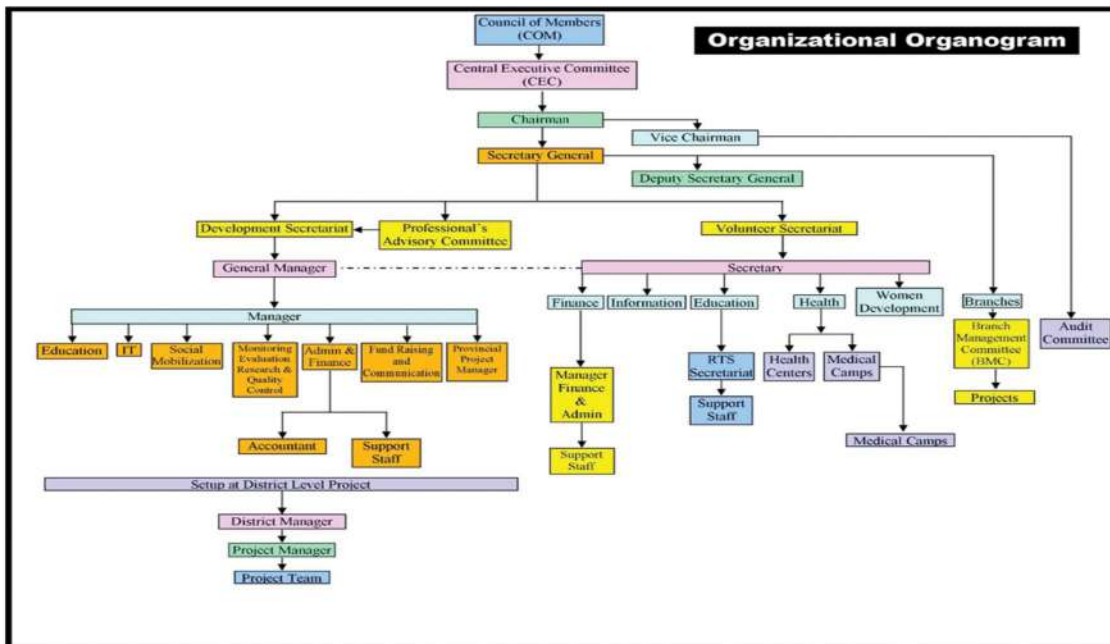
ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

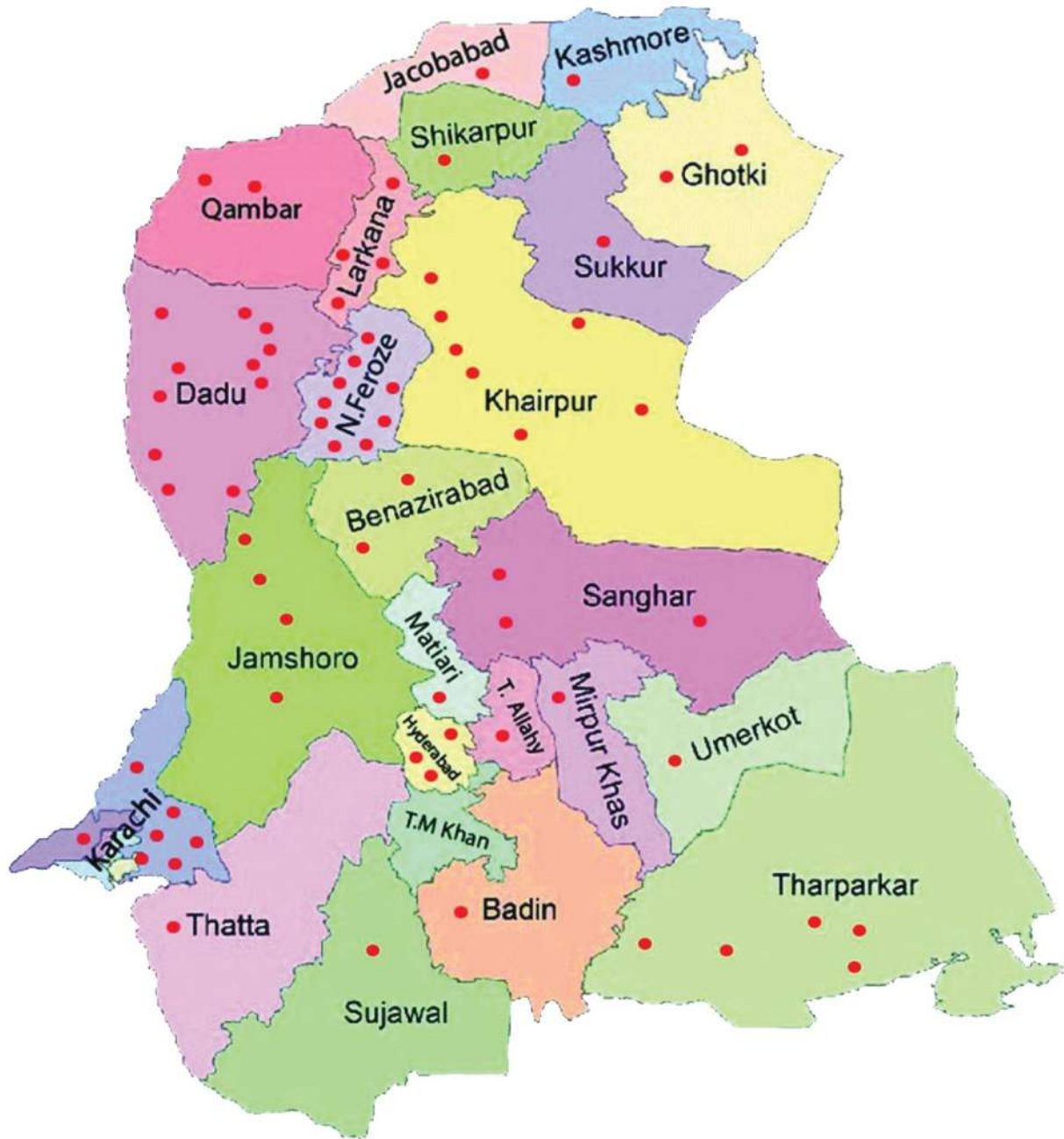

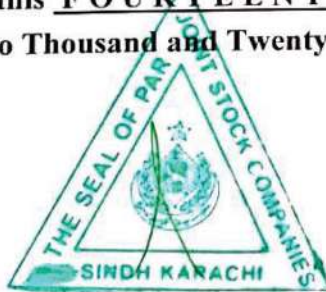


